Our bimonthly patient newsletter aims to keep you informed of services at Compass House and give you important insights into getting the most out of the Practice.




New Telephone System

Following your feedback and working with our Patient Participation Group to aid delivery, we are excited to announce that work is underway to move the Practice to a new telephone system called Babblevoice.

This will allow patients to be able to hold their place in the queue without the need to stay on the line, thanks to a call-back feature. There is also the option of automated booking of some appointments such as flu jabs, without talking to a member of staff, and will allow vulnerable patients such as those who are end of life, to skip the telephone messages. The system has been trialled at Brixham Hospital and we are in the planning stages of rolling it out fully. We are confident this change will ease the current frustrations patients have with the telephone lines.

We hope to have this new system implemented within the next month and will update Patients with a "go live" date as soon as we have this available. Please bear with us whilst the new system is being implemented and our Staff are learning as there may be some disruption.

HRT Prescription Prepayment Certificate

From 1st April 2023, women in England can now get cheaper Hormone Replacement Therapy (HRT) through a new Prescription Payment Certificate (PPC).

If you pay for NHS-prescribed HRT medication three or more times a year, the HRT PPC could save you money. It covers an unlimited number of certain HRT medicines for 12 months, regardless of why they are prescribed.

Compass House: A Month in Numbers What we did in April

Total number of patients registered at Compass House: 15,004



We provided 9114 clinical contacts by GPs, ANPs, Paramedic, Nurses, Pharmacists, Physios, and Social Prescribers.

5382 of these were face-to-face appointments.



We issued 29,224 Prescriptions.



We processed 4066 items of clinical post, answered 17,533 phone calls, processed 762 referrals, and actioned 752 online triage requests.

TALKWORKS Text-based Therapy Service

TALKWORKS, working in partnership with ieso, now offer a live, text-based therapy service for patients to access mental health support between 6am and 11pm, 7 days a week.

The free, confidential therapy sessions, which take place via a smartphone, tablet, or computer, offer support for low mood, anxiety, sleep difficulties, OCD, phobia management, and sleeping difficulties, and are best suited for those who are anxious talking to a clinician face-to-face or over the phone. The service also allows patients to access support at a time that works for them, in the comfort of their own home.

Type 2 Diabetes Prevention



Around 200,000 people are diagnosed each year with Type 2 Diabetes. Although modern life can make it hard to be healthy, for many people Type 2 Diabetes can be prevented by making small lifestyle changes such as managing weight, eating healthy, and being more active.
